## ABA Addendum and Treatment Form Updates Quick Reference Guide

Effective June 29, 2022, changes will be implemented to the Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) addendum and treatment forms in the Incedo Provider Portal (IPP). Please see the information below for a detailed description of the updates to, and use of, these forms. - 1. Changes to the ABA Treatment form:
  - a. New! Question regarding plans to provide services in a school setting: Providers will report if they have observed the participant in the school setting and consulted with the school personnel prior to making a recommendation for services to be temporarily rendered in that setting, as shown in the screenshot below.



 New! Question regarding plans to provide services in a clinic-based setting: Providers will report what percentage of direct ABA services (Billing code 97153) will be provided in a clinic-based setting, as shown in the screenshot below.

c. **Concurrent Treatment requests** <u>only</u>: Providers will be required to specifically report the utilization of the following authorized services for Billing codes 97153, 97155 and 97156, as shown in the screenshot below.



d. **Attestation:** The system will now autogenerate the name of the individual who completed the form and the date it was completed.

2. Changes to ABA Addendum Forms:

**Providers are required to submit addendum requests via the IPP.** Providers requesting to increase the intensity of currently authorized ABA services and/or requesting to add service(s) to a current authorization must follow the process described below. Once an addendum request is submitted through the IPP, Optum Maryland has up to 14 calendar days to make a determination on the addendum request.

Prior to submitting an addendum request, providers should obtain all necessary clinical information and objective data to support the request to avoid delays in processing the request.

Reference the alert titled: <u>ABA Provider Form Changes and Process to Request</u> <u>Addendums</u> to understand the steps on how to request an addendum to treatment.

Below are the changes made to the ABA Addendum Form:

a. Requested Start Date: An addendum to an ABA authorization cannot have a requested start date that exceeds 20 calendar days from the date of request submission. For reference, see Entering Backdated Authorizations: Update

b. New! Request to Increase Intensity of Authorized Services: Providers will be asked if they are utilizing 100% of the authorized services, to which they will have to attest, prior to requesting an increase in intensity of services.



- c. New! Reason for Requesting an Addendum to Treatment: Providers will be required to enter the reason(s) they are submitting an addendum to the authorized services. The provider may choose one or both of the following reasons for the addendum request:
  - i. New or increased intensity of challenging behaviors:
    - 1. Select either "emergence of new challenging behaviors" or
    - 2. "changes in current challenging behaviors"

Once selected, a pop-up appears for you to directly enter quantitative data to support the request.
